ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria:

### CORPORATION OF NIGERIA - ESTABLISHMENT, ETC. OF THE ASSET MANAGEMENT

(1) There is established the Asset Management Corporation of Nigeria (in this Act referred to as "the Corporation").

- (a) shall be a body corporate with a common seal, perpetual succession; and
- (b) may sue and be sued in its corporate name
